- Inventory management in accordance with the Student centre Policy Manual and FOH Standards Training, which includes bar counts, weighing kegs, daily & weekly reports submitted to management
- Smart Serve Certified (MUST HAVE)
- Set the bar for success before every shift, proper station set up in accordance with your training manuals. Tear down bar after each shift to ensure proper storage and rotation and following the cleanliness standards of the TMU-SC
- Clean the Pub before, during and after service and perform daily and weekly cleaning duties as assigned by Leads and Management
- Assist with guest requests above and beyond the norm by providing exceptional service!

Qualifications:

- Experience working in a bar with a strong understanding of mixology and alcohol service
- Able to work late nights, some events run past 2AM, bar shutdown potentially till 3AM
- Ability to work with the public, people skills are a must!
- Multi-tasking abilities
- Able to work 15-24 hours/week (provide 3 available shifts MIN)
- Sensitivity to diverse needs and respect for diversity and equity
- Positive and friendly attitude
- Cash handling
- Respond well to direction
